Access to Higher Education: Health and Social Care Professions Level 3 Full-time

Entry Requirements

You will achieve

This intensive course starts in September 2025 and will be completed in one year. Dates and times to be confirmed.

- You will need to be 19 when the course commences in September
- You will need to have GCSE English Language and Mathematics at grade C or above and at least a grade D in Science. The acceptance of Level 2 equivalents in English and Maths is based on the qualifications needed for your future career path.
- Learners MUST provide certificate(s) of qualification(s) gained
- All learners should have experience of vocational/voluntary work within their intended specialist area, prior to commencing the course
- Prospective students will be required to attend an interview prior to being enrolled on the programme and will be required to demonstrate sufficient fluency in reading and writing English

- Access to Higher Education Diploma Level 3 Health Professions, awarded by CAVA.
- You can achieve Level 3 credits validated by CAVA, which is a QAA recognised accreditation body. To achieve the Access to HE Diploma, you must achieve 60 credits.

Course Overview

The Access to Higher Education Diploma is for adults who left school without the qualifications they need but wish to study a health-related field at degree level.

The course covers:

- Health: health and disease, alternative therapies, and health care interventions
- Psychology: human behaviour, child development, health psychology, and more
- Biology: human circulation, cell transport, reproduction and more
- Study Skills: academic writing, presentations, and exam techniques

We also offer this course as a part-time course [https://www.barnsley.ac.uk/course/access-higher-education-health-science-professions-level-3-part-time/], which runs on evenings over two years.

Course Content

How will I be assessed?

You will be continually assessed on this programme through a wide variety of course work e.g. an essay, a report, a presentation and/or group work. Although there is no formal examination end of module tests are used to collect some evidence needed for assessment.

What Equipment Will I Need?

Stationery equipment will be required. Access to a computer/laptop, connection to the internet and printing facilties are highly recommended.

What can I do next?

On completion of this programme, you could apply for training in a career such as nursing, midwifery, physiotherapy or other paramedical professions such as chiropody, laboratory technician, physiotherapy, radiography, paramedical science, operating department technician, cardiology or audiology. You could also apply for other degrees such as Social Work; Health and Community Studies; Psychology, Justice and Criminology.

Students wishing to apply to University are advised to contact the relevant admissions tutor to check that the course is acceptable as an entry qualification for the degree programme they wish to enter.

How much does the course cost?

Course fees: £3,384. You can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan to pay for this course. If you are aged 19-23 and this is your first full level 3 qualification then you may not have to pay for the course.
