You will achieve

This course commences in September.

- You will need to have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- 'High Needs' funding for your support agreed by your local authority
- Attend an 'interview' with a staff member
- Attend taster/transition sessions in the department to help you settle in before you start
- You must be aged between 16-24 years old

- An accredited qualification, depending on your aims and aspirations
- Your personal targets
- Increased confidence, independence and social skills and of course, make new friends!

Course Overview

The Department of Learning for Living and Work offers support to students with additional and complex learning needs. Students follow a personalized curriculum with small classes and support workers. The courses include domestic skills, communication, community participation, early Maths and English, and personal development. Progression can lead to further study, supported living, volunteering, and more. Activities include enrichment sessions, IT skills, art, music, drama, and tutorials on various topics.

Course Content

This course is for those with complex additional needs.
