You will achieve

You can start an Apprenticeship at any time. This course runs for three years/ 1month. (maximum average

duration).

Entry requirements for the course:

- Qualifications related to the course Level 2 Standard Apprenticeship in Horticulture / Landscape Operative
- GCSE A* C or equivalent requirements and / or Functional Skills L2 Functional Skills passes in English and Maths
- Other requirements e.g. Disclosure Barring Service (DBS).
- You will need to find an employer to employ you as an apprentice. Please see our Apprenticeship vacancies.

Course Overview

This apprenticeship is designed for individuals pursuing a supervisory role in horticulture and landscape sectors, whether in public parks, private estates, or nurseries. You will gain valuable skills in supervising projects, business operations, plant identification, and environmental protection while specialising in either horticulture or landscape construction. Course Highlights:

- **Supervision and Leadership:** Oversee projects, manage teams, and solve practical problems using experience and judgement.
- Business Skills: Understand project planning, specifications, and operations management.
- Communication and Customer Care: Develop effective communication strategies with clients, the public, and colleagues, including the use of IT systems.
- Health and Safety: Implement and uphold safety protocols to protect workers and the
 environment.
- **Biodiversity and Heritage Protection:** Learn to manage and preserve the natural and historical features of landscapes.
- **Specialised Focus:** Choose between horticulture (soft landscape) or landscape construction (hard landscape).

Course Content

How will I be assessed?

Apprentices without Level 2 English and Maths must achieve this prior to taking the end point assessment.

The apprentice should produce a portfolio of evidence on-programme. The portfolio should contain employer appraisals, apprentice journal plus the mandatory qualifications.

The end point assessment will have the following elements:

- A synoptic practical assessment containing a range of practical activities
- Professional discussion
- On line knowledge assessment meeting the knowledge requirements of the standard
- Supervisory Studies Project

What Equipment Will I Need?

You will require a pen, note paper, safety boots, gloves, pencil and a ruler.

Where will I study?

You will study within the workplace and attend classes at Barnsley College, Wigfield Centre for Land Based Studies, Haverlands Lane, Worsborough, Barnsley, South Yorkshire S70 5NQ

What can I do next?

Progression options e.g. employment – Horticulture Team Leader, Landscape Supervisor, Assistant Head Gardener. Further study Higher National Diploma in Horticulture or Landscaping or undergraduate degree in Horticulture.

How much does the course cost?

There is no cost to being an apprentice. All costs associated with your apprenticeship, including the cost of training and your salary, will be paid by your employer.
