This qualification is ideal if you want to develop an understanding of adverse childhood experiences and pursue a career in the Childcare and Education industry.

## **Course Content**

This qualification will provide you with an opportunity to develop an understanding of adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) relevant to your current or future roles and will equip you with basic understanding of techniques for preventing and addressing ACEs in practice.

The qualification focuses on the 0-8 age range. You should cover the full range of ages but focus on their own experience/age group as appropriate to your current job role or interests.

#### As part of this course you will study the following units:

- Exploring childhood and family structures
- Introduction to adverse childhood experiences
- Understanding strategies to improve outcomes for children affected by adverse childhood experiences

#### How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed by completing course work and assignments set by your tutor.

# What Equipment Will I Need?

You will need to provide writing materials and stationery, a folder and a USB stick. Having access to a computer (computers can be accessed in College) would also be useful but it is not essential.
